YEAR IN REVIEW

13th Annual Stephen Ambrose Memorial Lecture



Helena's Marga Lincoln presents lecture on four of the ten unsung heroes featured in her new book, *Montana Grit*

n Friday, November 3rd, the 2023 Stephen Ambrose Memorial Lecture presented Helena-area journalist and writer, Marga Lincoln, author of *Montana Grit: Ten Unsung Heroes Who Dared to Make a Difference*, published by Farcountry Press this year.

The large community room at Lewis & Clark Library was full to capacity with interested and engaged attendees. During her talk, Lincoln highlighted four of the ten heroes chronicled in her book.

- Judge Charles L. Crum of Forsyth defended the Constitution to counter anti-German paranoia and hysteria during WWI.
- African-American nurse Octavia Bridgwater of Helena worked for decades to fight racial discrimination.
- Suffragette Hazel Hunkins of Billings was jailed for—and then 60 years later rewarded for—fighting for a woman's right to vote.
- Accountant Elouise Cobell persisted for more than 13 years before succeeding in her suit against the U.S. government for mismanaging billions of dollars in natural resource royalties owed to the Blackfeet Tribe.

Lincoln spent five years researching these and six other "ordinary" Montanans who, she writes, "are heroes because their choices and actions required courage, and they toiled not just for themselves but for the good of all."

Lincoln answered thoughtful questions from attendees and received a standing ovation at the end of her lecture. Many in the Helena area consider her a modern-day hero for the dozens of stories she wrote about artists, musicians, writers, and others throughout Montana during her career in journalism. It's not surprising that she felt compelled to bring these strong and inspiring historical Montanans into the limelight, just as she has done with modern-day Montanans.

Our thanks to all who came to hear Lincoln's inspiring and memorable lecture. A wonderful evening was had by all!





In the next six years, the Library experienced the best of times with its beautiful remodel and the worst of times with the unfortunate COVID pandemic. Throughout these challenging years, our many Library Foundation donors both continued and increased their generosity and unwavering support to ensure the Helena Library and its branches could meet their mission.

Being a member of the Board brings the opportunity to engage with a diverse and dedicated group. Each member serves in different ways depending on their accomplished backgrounds, and brings unique perspectives on how to best ensure the Foundation's donated funds are used most responsibly.

Among many highlights of serving on the Board is the Library staff's annual "Wish List" presentation of their creative proposals to use Foundation funds to enhance the library programs and activities. At Board meetings, members have the opportunity to meet many of the talented Helena Library staff when they make presentations about their specific programs. With gratitude, the staff inform us specifically about how the Foundation funding has supported their efforts. We also learn about Library Director John Finn's most sincere dedication and continual efforts to improve the Library and branches and to support their excellent staff.

Annually, the Board makes a "road trip" site visit to one of the three branch libraries to both show support for these dedicated librarians and to learn about their specific library's services. As I step down from the board, I am filled with gratitude for the opportunity to learn and grow. Many thanks to all for sharing this common goal of a thriving and enduring public library.


Foundation Funds in Review

During FY 2023, the Foundation Board took on the task of improving, clarifying, and restructuring the organization's finances. Due to the diligent work of our Treasurer, Pad McCracken, and the Foundation's Budget and Asset Management Committee, our accounts and investments will cost less to manage and earn more. With the complex mix of trust income, money market and CD investments, and an "endowment" fund we will now refer to as our "sustainability" fund, the Foundation can better explain to board members and donors how funds are managed and invested. Our expense reports are much improved as well, showing that the lion's share of Foundation spending is meeting our goal to make our great Lewis & Clark Library even better!

In a nutshell, at the end of FY 2023 (June 30, 2023) the Foundation's total assets were \$1,120,749. Our D.A. Davidson Endowment/Sustainability Fund held \$762,693. Just over \$200,000 is held in what is now called the Special Projects Account almost entirely in high-interest-bearing CDs in order to keep money more readily available to support larger Library needs. At the end of FY 2023, there was a total of \$158,056 in cash accounts.

We are pleased to report that \$66,099 was received in unrestricted charitable contributions from generous donors during FY 2023. And a total of \$97,261 came from our valued trusts (see breakdown below).

Foundation expenditures totaled \$192,014 in FY 2023, following a budget that allowed up to \$195,400 in expenditures. The Expenditures pie graph shows where we spent funds in the fiscal year.





Taffy Miller joined the Foundation in 2021, smack in the middle of the COVID pandemic, when we were meeting via Zoom and not interacting as much in person. Much of our work focused on supporting Library staff who were endeavoring to meet the needs of patrons amidst the closures and restrictions.

Taffy always asked helpful questions and participated in meaningful ways. She actively served on the Board Policy and Practice Committee and the Events Planning Committee.

Last April, on National Library Workers Day (part of the National Library Week celebration) the Board wanted to do something special for Lewis and Clark County's library workers. Taffy reached out to her niece, Freda Wilkinson of Big Sky Brokers, who generously donated free lunches from RockStarr BBQ.
